On May 23rd I was lucky enough to be invited to go and see the transmission of "A Show Called Fred". As all members who saw these shows know. there was not a studio audience, so this was an experience that was even more out of the ordinary. Unfortunately I did have to go to work on the day of the transmission, or else I would have been at the studios all day. I did manage to get there fairly early though, and equipped with a visitor's pass which Max had left for me at the reception desk, made my way to Studio 4. After being greeted by Peter, Spike and Max, I was ushered to a small corner of the room, and was just in time to see a run-through of the Show. No sooner had this finished, than another one started, and so it went on, until three quarters of an hour before the transmission. I was then shown around the control room, and I am sure that you have no idea of the amount of work that goes on before a show of this kind can be televised. The control room was absolutely covered with plugs, switches, and tape recorders. All the music for the show is recorded on tape beforehand, so as to achieve a better sound reproduction, and I felt that I needed at least six pairs of eyes to see all that was going on: - The producer rushing frantically around giving instructions to everybody, the make-up girls who deftly applied and removed those very effective moustaches and beards that were so often used, and of course the masses of cameramen.

If you remember on this particular date the show was divided into two main sketches - "Ying ton Tonight" and "Escapers Club", and each portion of the room was used for one particular part. Right in the middle of the room was an outsize projection screen, and every so often a film was projected on to it, in the form of a large expanse of water. Spike knelt in front of the screen, facing a T.V. set with a camera hovering above him, and practiced the movements of the Australian crawl. That does give you an idea of how that effect was made.

I have two regrets, however, (a) that I was so enthralled in my conversation to a couple of reporters, that I missed seeing the actual transmission, and (b) that I forgot

to take a note book and pencil with me, in order to give you a fuller report!
